# **PARISH NOTICES**

**CORONAVIRUS:** The following advice has been issued by the Church of England:

- Should you wish not to receive from the chalice (common cup) and instead only receive the host (bread) you are still receiving the full Sacrament of Christ.
- The Chalice is made of silver which is antibacterial. The wine is 20% proof which kills germs. The purificator will wipe germs away, and we turn the chalice between each communicant.
- Do <u>NOT</u> intinct (dip) your wafer in the chalice more germs are conveyed that way with fingers touching the wine.
- We will continue to share the Peace. You may like to wear gloves or simply acknowledge each other. Sensible precautions of washing your hands before and after the Service will also help prevent the spread of germs.
