Hopefully the weather will be kind to the soon to be newly-weds and they are able to enjoy our church grounds which have had so much care and attention lavished on them during lockdown. My sincere thanks to all who have worked so hard.

As always please be assured of my prayers and best wishes for the coming week. I hope to see as many as are able to join us this weekend for Mass. Regardless, I hope you stay safe and well, confident and enfolded in the love of God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
