A MUSICAL WEEKEND:

<u>CAMERATA CHAMBER ORCHESTRA CONCERT</u>: Saturday 11 March, 7.30pm Music including Symphony no 8 by Joseph Haydn. Free admission with a retiring collection, all proceeds to St John's Church.

MOZART'S REQUIEM: Sunday 12 March, 6.30pm As part of our Lenten devotions we will be performing, within a liturgical context Mozart's Requiem. Our choir, accompanied by the St John's Ensemble, with fabulous soloists will sing the Mass whilst the Eucharist is offered. Do put it in your diary – it will be well worth attending.

YOUR CHURCH NEEDS YOU: As we approach Holy Week and Easter we will need help with some of our services. For instance, we need 12 people to volunteer their feet for washing during the Maundy Thursday Eucharist. We also need readers for Passion Gospel on Palm Sunday, and lots of people to steward our many services. Please see the Vicar if you are willing to help or he'll just start picking on people!

FAIRTRADE: Did you know we are in Fairtrade Fortnight (27 Feb - 12 Mar)? As part of our endeavour to become an Eco-church, we are encouraged to buy Fairtrade products whenever we can. By doing so, we are supporting farmers and workers, as they receive their fair share of the price of the product. Do look out for the new Fairtrade Mark with an arrow pointing to the side of the box where you can read further details. Everyone is encouraged to join the Fairtrade Foundation, either as an individual or as a church or organisation.

CHURCHYARD TWINNING: Some of you may have seen the notices in the toilets stating that for £60 it has been twinned with a toilet in a developing country to help them achieve better sanitation. For Lent this year our Diocese has come up with a scheme to twin churchyards with families of farmers in Kenya. £60 will help a family living in rural Migori with three years training in sustainable organic farming. Starting with small kitchen gardens families can grow enough to eat to fight poverty, set up small businesses and send their children to school. We are proposing to hold a coffee morning and cake sale in church on **Saturday 18 March**. Please come along and have a coffee, buy a cake, meet up with friends and hopefully we will raise the £60 to help a family. Any excess monies will be put towards the Easter flowers.

PARISH LUNCH: Owing to the increasing popularity of the monthly parish lunch we have made a few changes to the booking procedure. In future the numbers will be limited to 36 people and when the list is full it will be removed from church. The main course will be on the list, if anyone wants anything different they will have to provide it themselves, ready prepared. If people put their names down and then find that they cannot attend would they please let Marian Davies (07557 952707, Di Tovey (263669) or Lorraine Ioannou (213648) know. If there is anyone in the parish who would like to prepare a meal (and wash-up) occasionally please speak to one of the above who will give you more details. The next parish lunch will be on **26 March**, menu yet to be decided.

COVID GUIDANCE:

- Receiving communion in both kinds is not compulsory (as our recent practice has shown). If you would like to receive the chalice the offer is there. If you would prefer not to receive from the common cup then simply receive the host and walk back to your places. It is an entirely personal decision.
- Intincting/dipping your wafer into the wine is not permitted.
- Mandatory Social Distancing has ceased, however, please be mindful when choosing somewhere to sit as some may still prefer to keep at a respectable distance and/or wear a face covering. If you would like some space no-one will be offended if you say so.
