YOUR CHURCH NEEDS YOU: As we approach Holy Week and Easter we will need help with some of our services. For instance, we need **12 people to volunteer their feet for washing** during the Maundy Thursday Eucharist. CHURCHYARD TWINNING: Some of you may have seen the notices in the toilets stating that for £60 it has been twinned with a toilet in a developing country to help them achieve better sanitation. For Lent this year our Diocese has come up with a scheme to twin churchyards with families of farmers in Kenya. £60 will help a family living in rural Migori with three years training in sustainable organic farming. Starting with small kitchen gardens families can grow enough to eat to fight poverty, set up small businesses and send their children to school. We are proposing to hold a coffee morning and cake sale in church on **Saturday 18 March**. Please come along and have a coffee, buy a cake, meet up with friends and hopefully we will raise the £60 to help a family. Any excess monies will be put towards the Easter flowers.

COVID GUIDANCE:

- Receiving communion in both kinds is not compulsory (as our recent practice has shown). If you would like to receive the chalice the offer is there. If you would prefer not to receive from the common cup then simply receive the host and walk back to your places. It is an entirely personal decision.
- Intincting/dipping your wafer into the wine is not permitted.
- Mandatory Social Distancing has ceased, however, please be mindful when choosing somewhere to sit as some may still prefer to keep at a respectable distance and/or wear a face covering.
