



Welcome to St John's for this Service.

Today, we offer to God our hearty thanksgiving for this House of Prayer, dedicated and consecrated to God's glory 150 years ago, in the name of St John the Evangelist. We give thanks for all who have built, adorned, ministered, and worshipped in our church before us. We pray for the life of the Parish in our own day and for our work in making new disciples, transforming communities, and going deeper into God as we seek to Live God's Love. And we pray for the Church in the future - for those who will be nurtured here to proclaim the love, life, and light of God in future generations.

During the Eucharist we continue to rejoice in the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead and in the example and contribution St John has made to the life of the Church universal, our own lives, and the life of this community. As we hear God's word and proclaim all that God has done, we can be confident that we shall share Christ's victory over death and know eternal life in him. We pray that the light of the risen Christ may bring peace, comfort, reassurance, and guidance to all in need.

It is a particular joy to welcome former vicars, curates, associate ministers, readers, and those who have discerned their vocation here - and their families - and Bishop Alan on his return to active ministry following a period of convalescence.

The posture directions in this order of service are optional. Please stand, sit, or kneel as you prefer. A collection is received during the Service for the work of the Church. The New Testament Reading

A reading from the first letter of St John.

We declare to you what was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life— this life was revealed, and we have seen it and testify to it, and declare to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was revealed to us— we declare to you what we have seen and heard so that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. We are writing these things so that our joy may be complete.

This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him there is no darkness at all. If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The Gospel

Alleluia! Alleluia!

The Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory. Alleluia!

The Lord be with you.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St John.

Jesus said to Peter, 'Follow me.'

Peter turned and saw the disciple whom Jesus loved following them; he was the one who had reclined next to Jesus at the supper and had said, 'Lord, who is it that is going to betray you?' When Peter saw him, he said to Jesus, 'Lord, what about him?' Jesus said to him, 'If it is my will that he remain until I come, what is that to you? Follow me!' So the rumour spread in the community that this disciple would not die. Yet Jesus did not say to him that he would not die, but, 'If it is my will that he remain until I come, what is that to you?'

This is the disciple who is testifying to these things and has written them, and we know that his testimony is true. But there are also many other things that Jesus did; if every one of them were written down, I suppose that the world itself could not contain the books that would be written.

All glory and honour be yours always and everywhere, mighty creator, ever-living God, through Jesus Christ our Lord; for he is the Word before all creation. the Life made manifest, the Light who shines in the darkness. He is the living Bread who has come down from heaven, the Good Shepherd, who lays down his life for the sheep, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. He stands among us in his risen power, and shows us his hands and his side. With joy we worship him as our Lord and our God. Therefore with all the angels of heaven we lift our voices to proclaim the glory of your name and sing our joyful hymn of praise:

♪ Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you.
